1 Council Welcome and Acknowledgement

The Chairperson, Aaron van Egmond, welcomed the Councillors-elect and members of the gallery to the Swearing-in Ceremony and acknowledged that Council is gathered on the traditional land of the Bunurong People of the Kulin Nation and offers its respect to Elders past, present and future.

2 Introduction and Congratulatory Remarks

The Chairperson congratulated the candidates on their election and explained that there is a statutory requirement under the *Local Government Act 2020* for each to take the Oath or Affirmation of Office and make a declaration to abide by the Model Councillor Code of Conduct before candidates can officially assume the role and responsibilities of a Councillor.

3 Oath or Affirmation of Office and Model Councillor Code of Conduct Declaration

The Chairperson explained the process for taking the oath or affirmation of office as follows:

Each Councillor-elect had the option to either take the oath or make an affirmation of office, which incorporates the declaration to abide by the Model Councillor Code of Conduct.

Each Councillor-elect spoke the oath or affirmation of office aloud, then signed the oath or affirmation of office.

The Chief Executive Officer witnessed the oath or affirmation of office.

The Chief Executive Officer and those in attendance congratulated the new Councillors, the Chief Executive Officer then asked the Councillor to take their allocated seat in the Chamber.

When all Councillors had been sworn in the Chief Executive Officer invited the Councillors to say a few words to the people in the gallery and viewers watching on the livestream.

Cr Daria Kellander – Altona Ward

The Chief Executive Officer stated that the swearing-in ceremony concluded, thanked everyone for their attendance and invited all present for refreshments.


